## **Ste. Chapelle and Employees Make \$10,500 Donation to The Idaho Foodbank**

Ste. Chapelle Winery and its employees will donate \$10,500 to The Idaho Foodbank at 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 31 at the winery in Sunny Slope.

The presentation by Ascentia Wine Estates Vice President of Operations Glenn Coogan to Foodbank President and CEO Karen Vauk will be part of the Ste. Chapelle Trick or Sweets Fun and Food Drive, which will be from noon to 5 p.m. at the winery, 19348 Lowell Rd, Caldwell.

Ascentia Wine Estates, through an employee, friends and family wine sale, contributed a total of \$41,000 dollars to the Redwood Empire Food Bank, Northwest Harvest and The Idaho Foodbank. For every case purchased by an individual, \$5 per case was distributed to these Sonoma County and Pacific Northwest food banks, along with nearly \$2,500 in personal contributions made by employees, friends and family. The program ran July 17 – August 14.

On Saturday, the public is also invited to bring a non-perishable food item or cash donation and enjoy tasty wines and be-witching sweets. For just \$5 people may keep their Ste. Chapelle wine glasses and a special gift from Weiser Classic Candy.

There will also be a raffle for prizes that will include a \$400 portable butcher's table with drawer and wine rack. Tickets will cost \$3, or 2 for \$5. Proceeds will benefit The Idaho Foodbank.
